SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE - JANUARY 30, 2022

Sermon –"Communion and Community – Part IV" (Rev. Bob MacKenzie)

Scripture – <u>Colossians 3:5-17</u>

The Christian faith involves both communion with God in Christ through the Holy Spirit and living in community as God's own people. The Old Testament covenant between God and his chosen nation Israel included duties to both God and to one's covenant brother and sister, as the Ten Commandments make clear. The new covenant in Christ is based on our individual and corporate communion with Christ through the Spirit and calls on believers to love one another in community. We will look at what it means to abide in Christ and to love one another, which together make up a fruitful Christian life.

For the next couple of weeks, worship services will continue to be available by Zoom only. The link will be sent out from the Church Office on Thursday. A reminder that services are recorded and made available from Trinity's website.

The church will remain closed for in-person worship, as well as for events, until February 8. Session will continue to monitor the developing COVID situation and will reassess at their February meeting.

TRINITY MISSION ACTIVITIES



Every January for the last several years, a Trinity team has come together to provide frozen meals for the refugees residing at Matthew House. In the past, we have met together to use Trinity's fabulous kitchen, but COVID protocols led us to do it differently last year. People made casseroles, soups, or baking in their homes, and then dropped them off to a central location, where they were stored frozen and then delivered to Matthew House. We will do the same thing this year in order to be able to provide meals safely.

Matthew House is very appreciative of our meals, and the need is even greater this year because they, like other groups, are shortstaffed. If you wish to participate in this ministry, please prepare a casserole (large family size, eg. 11" x 13" pan) or other meal, or baking and bring it to Susan Hahn's home by Sunday, February 6. The freezer is empty and waiting for your donation! One note: if you are making a meal, <u>no pork please</u> as they serve a number of Muslim clients.
