SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE – MARCH 13, 2022

Sermon – “Preparing for Departure: Called to Trust” (Rev. John Fair)

Scripture – [John 14:1-14](#)

Rev. John Fair will present a new 8-part sermon series for Lent and Easter, with the overall theme of “*Preparing for Departure*”. The departure is the death of Christ and how he prepared his disciples and himself for it.

- We will use the Gospel of John and the Upper Room Discourse found in John chapters 13-17 for the first five Sundays. The Upper Room Discourse is John’s record of Jesus’ conversation with his disciples the evening before his departure, his death on Good Friday.
- On Palm Sunday we will go back to John 12 and Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem to the praise of the people.
- On Good Friday we will be in John 19 and on Easter Sunday we go to John 20.

John, the gospel writer, will provide us with a rich glimpse into the events of the first Holy Week and how they serve as a sure foundation for our faith and salvation.



Sunday’s worship service will also include the celebration of Communion. For those attending the service in person, prepackaged Communion supplies (which are not gluten-free) will be available.

For those who are joining the service through Zoom, please feel free to use whatever you might have on hand at home ... water, wine, or juice and a cracker, a piece of bread, or a roll.

Trinity’s sanctuary is open for in-person worship, and worship services will continue to be available via Zoom. As in previous weeks, the link to Sunday’s service will be sent out from the Church Office on Thursday. Our services are recorded and made available from Trinity’s website.

TRINITY'S UPDATED COVID PROTOCOLS – MARCH 6, 2022

Trinity has announced plans to return to in-church worship beginning on March 6th, 2022. With the recent announcement by Ontario that proof of vaccination is not required, but is voluntary, to enter all indoor public settings, Session has carefully considered the matter and has decided to take a cautionary approach for the time being. To assist you with what to expect while worshipping at the church, here is a description of the practices we will follow:

- **As you enter the church, those eligible for vaccination will need to show proof of being fully vaccinated unless you have previously done so, or have a valid exemption.**
- You will need to wear a mask. Bring your own or disposable masks will be available at the church.
- Hand sanitizing will be available to allow you to clean your hands when entering and leaving the church.
- Seating will no longer be required to respect physical distancing although you may wish to do so.
- Children are to remain with family members as there will be no Sunday School.
- David Chin will be providing the prelude and postlude live from the sanctuary each Sunday. The services will include musical selections that have been pre-recorded by the praise team. Congregation singing (with masks) and responsive readings (with masks) are permitted.
- Communion services will be on the second Sunday of each month. A pre-filled, individual communion package will be available for those wishing to participate in communion. It contains a non-gluten free wafer and grape juice. You may also bring your own communion bread, wine, or grape juice if you prefer.
- For those attending the in-person service, offering envelopes can be placed in the offering plate as you enter the church foyer.
- We will have coffee and tea available after the service in the church lobby. Those who stay for coffee must be seated at tables.
- For those who are uncomfortable or unable to attend church in person, the service will continue to be on Zoom. Those attending via Zoom will be able to chat with each other before and after the service.
