Sermon – “Resistance is Futile!” (Rev. Dr. Victor Lujetic)

Scripture – [Acts 26:9-14](#)

Our guest minister for this week, and for the month of May, will be Rev. Dr. Victor Lujetic. Victor is a retired Baptist minister who was born and raised in the United States. He has served congregations in Ottawa and Toronto, as well as in Maryland, Virginia, and New York. Last August, Victor retired after forty-three years in the ministry. He and his wife, Sally, have moved back to Ottawa and they have two daughters, Hannah and Sarah.

During Sunday’s worship service, Victor will be providing some music for the congregation. He will teach the children a song called “Bananas for the Lord” during the Children’s Time, and will also share another piece during the service, which the children may also enjoy.

## LOCAL INITIATIVES TO SUPPORT THE PEOPLE OF UKRAINE

The Campus Minister at Algonquin College, Yuriy Derkach, is appealing to Ottawa area churches and residents for help for the people of Ukraine.

**Medical supplies** – specifically first-aid kits (NATO standard), tourniquets, painkillers, antiseptics, wound care products, and baby food – can be accepted. Arrangements are in place for these supplies to be shipped to Poland, and driven across by border by volunteers.

## TRINITY'S UPDATED COVID PROTOCOLS — MARCH 6, 2022

Trinity has announced plans to return to in-church worship beginning on March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022. With the recent announcement by Ontario that proof of vaccination is not required, but is voluntary, to enter all indoor public settings, Session has carefully considered the matter and has decided to take a cautionary approach for the time being. To assist you with what to expect while worshipping at the church, here is a description of the practices we will follow:

- **As you enter the church, those eligible for vaccination will need to show proof of being fully vaccinated unless you have previously done so, or have a valid exemption.**
- **You will need to wear a mask.** Bring your own or disposable masks will be available at the church.
- Hand sanitizing will be available to allow you to clean your hands when entering and leaving the church.
- Seating will no longer be required to respect physical distancing although you may wish to do so.
- Children are to remain with family members as there will be no Sunday School.
- David Chin will be providing the prelude and postlude live from the sanctuary each Sunday. The services will include musical selections that have been pre-recorded by the praise team. Congregation singing (with masks) and responsive readings (with masks) are permitted.
- Communion services will be on the second Sunday of each month. A pre-filled, individual communion package will be available for those wishing to participate in communion. It contains a non-gluten free wafer and grape juice. You may also bring your own communion bread, wine, or grape juice if you prefer.
- For those attending the in-person service, offering envelopes can be placed in the offering plate as you enter the church foyer.
- We will have coffee and tea available after the service in the church lobby. Those who stay for coffee must be seated at tables.
- For those who are uncomfortable or unable to attend church in person, the service will continue to be on Zoom. Those attending via Zoom will be able to chat with each other before and after the service.

*Stay safe. Stay well.*
