Sermon – "Aiming for the Goal Posts" (Rev. Dave Whitecross) Scripture – <u>Acts 2:42-47; Colossians 1:24-29</u>

We are happy to welcome Rev. Dave Whitecross to Trinity! On the recommendation of Trinity's Search Committee, an invitation has been extended to Rev. Whitecross to preach for the call at Trinity. We hope that you are able to attend Sunday's worship service in person, or via Zoom.
