SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE — AUGUST 28, 2022

Sermon – "Steps to a Win-Win Decision" (Rev. Dr. Victor Lujetic) Scripture – <u>Acts 15:1-22</u>

We are pleased that Rev. Dr. Victor Lujetic is returning to Trinity on Sunday; Victor will continue to join us for worship for the next few weeks. Victor is a retired Baptist minister, born and raised in the United States. He has served congregations in Ottawa, Toronto, as well as in the US.
