The loose offering collected this week will go to Urban Christian Outreach.




**Trinity Presbyterian Church's



We are pleased to let you know that our Mission focus for March will be Urban Christian Outreach, and Jill Wilson, the Executive Director, will be our speaker for the Mission Spot on Sunday March 5.

Urban Christian Outreach is a ministry to marginalized and street people in downtown Ottawa, and has been in operation for 35 years. Jill will also be available after the service to provide more information and answer questions.

We will be starting a collection for Jill for the next three Sundays (March 5, 12 and 19) to collect mens' gloves, hats, socks, winter coats, boots, track shoes, and gift cards (Tim Hortons, McDonald's, A&W, grocery cards) that she can offer to those in need.
